Hear from the MyCC about the efforts undertaken to date, to enforce the prohibition against cartels. Get greater insights into when “price-fixing”, “market-sharing”, “bid-rigging”, and other prohibited horizontal agreements may arise, and what the legal remedies for affected enterprises, businesses and consumers are.

Explore the opportunities to advise and represent clients through the different stages of advisory and complaints, investigations, representations, and litigation.

The MyCC’s leniency programme is a key tool for identifying and taking action against cartels while obtaining full or partial immunity from fines for leniency applicants. Hear the MyCC perspective about how its leniency programme operates.

About the Speakers



Iskandar Ismail has helmed the Investigation & Enforcement Division in the MyCC since February 2013. He graduated from the International Islamic University Malaysia with an LLB (Hons) degree in 1997. He holds an LLM degree in International and Comparative Law from the George Washington University Law School, Washington, DC. He was called to the

Malaysian Bar as an advocate and solicitor of the High Court of Malaya in August 1998 and began his legal career in Puncak Niaga (M) Sdn Bhd.

He later served Bank Negara Malaysia as a Prosecuting Officer in 1998 and became part of the pioneer prosecuting team in the Legal Department until 2005. Prior to joining the MyCC as its Director, he was an Assistant Trial Attorney with the United Nations for the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda in Tanzania for eight years, prosecuting genocide and serious violations of international human rights laws. He is currently listed in the Justice Rapid Response expert roster, a professional service provider to entities that have the jurisdiction or mandate to investigate, fact-find or carry out inquiries wherever mass atrocities may have occurred.
