A. LEGAL REFORMS

- MyCC is in the midst of amending and reviewing the Competition Act 2010 [Act 712]
- The proposed amendments are aimed at strengthening and firming the legal structure
- The proposed amendments are now being deliberated at the Ministry's level



A. LEGAL REFORMS

- The proposed amendments include:
 - (i) extension of investigation powers -request for information and
 - documents
 - (ii) procedure on the grant of block exemption



Container Depot Operators' Case

On 1 June 2016, MyCC issued a decision against:

- (i) an information technology service provider to the shipping and logistics industry in the Penang area; and
- (ii) four Container Depot Operators

for engaging in price-cartel activities.



Containerchain and the Container Depot Operators have infringed the Act by entering into vertical agreements by way of concerted practices which had the effect of the Container Depot Operators increasing the Depot Gate Charges from RM5 to RM25 and the Container Depot Operators fixing a rebate of RM5 offered to hauliers



Container Depot Operators have infringed the Act by entering into a horizontal agreement to fix the RM25 Depot Gate Charges together with the RM5 rebate in the market for the provision of empty container storage, maintenance and handling services within a five (5) to fifteen (15) kilometers radius of the Penang Port.



MyEG's Case

MyCC's finding that MyEG together with MyEG Commerce had infringed the Act by abusing its dominant position in harming competition in the downstream market in which MyEG Commerce is participating as an insurance agent for online PLKS renewal applications.



Different conditions were imposed to equivalent transactions with its competitors to the extent that it has harmed competition in the downstream market for the sale of Mandatory Insurances.
